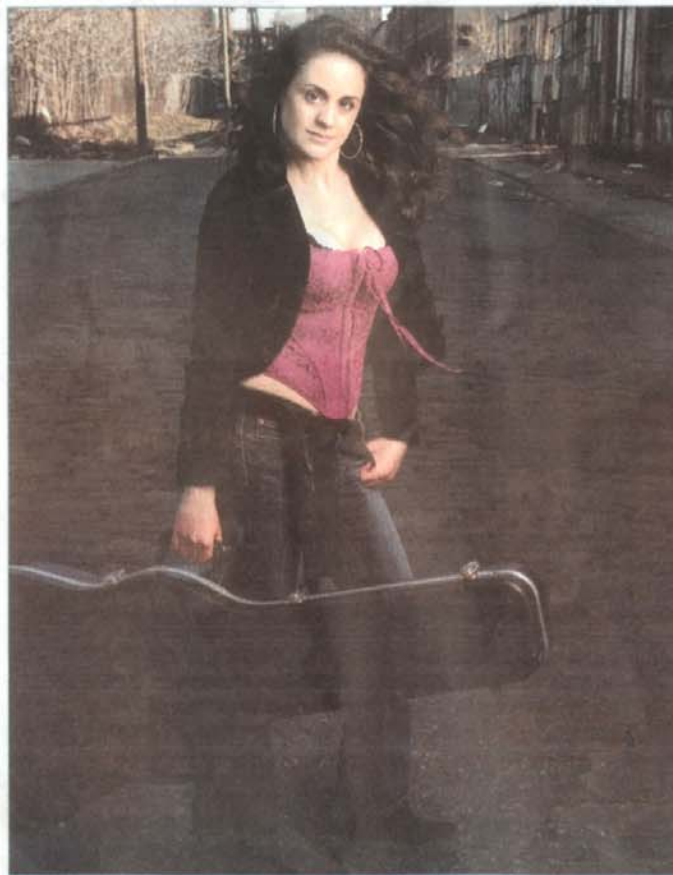
**10pm**
